He served 26 years as a government official in the following administrative staff positions:

- White House Fellow to the President of the United States, the Honorable George W. Bush
- Special Assistant to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, the Honorable Anthony J. Principi
- Director of Administration (and Aide) to the Secretary of the Navy, the Honorable Gordon R. England (Bush administration) and the Honorable Richard J. Danzig (Clinton administration).

Mr. McBeth coordinated transition-related actions for the Department of the Navy during the 2001 Clinton-Bush Presidential transition, served as Transition Coordinator for the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in 2007, and in support of the Department of Defense for the 2009 Bush-Obama Presidential transition.

As a Naval Officer, he served in the following military staff positions:

- Special Assistant for Strategy to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff
- Director of Strategy (N00Z) and Special Counsel to the Chief of Naval Operations
- Special Assistant, Navy Special Project (N09V) to the Vice Chief of Naval Operations
- Special Assistant, Deputy Chief of Naval Operations, Information, Plans and Strategy.

As a senior advisor to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Admiral Michael G. Mullen, during both the Bush and Obama administrations, he developed strategies that synthesized myriad actions, challenges, and opportunities into an executable engagement plan. The Chairman credited Mr. McBeth's strategies as having made his goals and objectives actionable.

A 1987 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Mr. McBeth holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Political Science, a Master of Arts degree from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University, in cooperation with Harvard University, and a Master of Science in National Security Strategy from the National War College, National Defense University, Washington D.C.

As a naval officer, Mr. McBeth was Commanding Officer of USS McCampbell (DDG 85), a Flight IIA Arleigh Burke class guided missile destroyer, and USS Tempest (PC 2), a long-range insertion/extraction ship for U.S. Navy SEAL forces. Service in five other warships, an Aegis cruiser, two Aegis destroyers, and two guided missile frigates, highlight his naval career.

As an O-4 (Lieutenant Commander), the President of the United States, the Honorable George W. Bush, awarded him the Legion of Merit. Later, as an O-5 (Commander), the Secretary of Defense, the Honorable Robert Gates, awarded him the Defense Superior Service Medal.

Mr. McBeth holds a Top Secret (Sensitive Compartmented Information) security clearance.
